**Membership**  
Membership is open to all staff interested in research, evidence-based practice and innovation. Council leadership will be elected from the membership and will serve for a minimum of two years. The first year of council leadership will be in the role of co-leader and the second year will be as council leader. Elections will be held annually to replace the off-going co-leader.



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- Position clinical nurses to disseminate new knowledge internally and externally
- Conduct Delphi study to identify topics
- Offer knowledge and skill building sessions
- Develop research teams with mentors

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## NKIC Charter with Measures and Deliverables

**Measures:** *How will we measure our success - outcomes?*

1. Increase the number of clinical nurse led research studies from 4 to 6 (NKI).
2. Increase dissemination of research findings by clinical nurses from baseline to (NK2):
  - a. Internal dissemination - presentations, baseline = 1, increase to 2
  - b. External dissemination - presentations, baseline = 0, increase to 2
  - c. External dissemination - manuscripts, baseline = 0, increase to 1
3. Increase a) evaluation and b) use of evidence-based findings by clinical nurses to (NK3):
  - a. Establish a baseline (new practice and existing practice)
  - b. Increase use by 10 percent


**Deliverables:** *What will the team improve - structure, process?*

Research

1. Write one completed ICU-approved nursing research study in the prescribed format.
2. Conduct two clinical nurse led research studies on topics generated from Delphi study.

Dissemination of research

1. Develop and sustain New Knowledge Dissemination Series (frequency of each topic to be determined)
  - Abstract Writing
  - Poster Presentations
  - Podium Presentations
  - Writing for Publication

## NKI Measures and Deliverables

- Increase dissemination of research findings by clinical nurses (and interprofessional team)

## Writing an Abstract

### Stages of Writing an Abstract

Plan	Draft	Review	Peer Review	Edit	Package
<p><b>What is an Abstract?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A condensed version of a larger work, e.g. a paper or presentation</li> <li>A self-contained document – stands alone and makes sense</li> </ul> <p><b>Helpful Hint:</b> current knowledge of topic?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Read abstracts that are journals for for:</li> <li>Select an innovative-cutting edge-relevant topic</li> <li>Write an attention-grabbing title</li> <li>Select the NK2 conference track</li> <li>Ensure objectives match content</li> <li>Format using headings if word count limit allows</li> <li>Check grammar, spelling, readability – make it easy for the reviewer to follow the story</li> <li>Build presentation experience – start with local conference submission, co-present with a mentor or experienced presenter</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Review instructions – word count, format, headings</li> <li>Draft in Word file (even if submission format is electronic)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Allow sufficient time</li> <li>Set aside draft and read with fresh eyes</li> <li>Ask for grammar, spelling, flow, sentence punctuation</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Select someone who is rigorous and will offer constructive feedback</li> <li>Allow sufficient time before due date</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Consider comments of reviewer(s)</li> <li>Edit to strengthen abstract</li> <li>Revise spelling, flow, etc.</li> <li>Revise, revise!</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Revise author guidelines</li> <li>Use a style that is easy to read and follow</li> <li>Make it easy for reviewer(s) to read and find key elements</li> </ul>

**Why Write An Abs**

- Selection** – Submission presentations/journals proposals, grants
- Assess audience** – help if they should read an article or attend a presentation
- Indexing** – contains keywords that allow for searching of on-line data

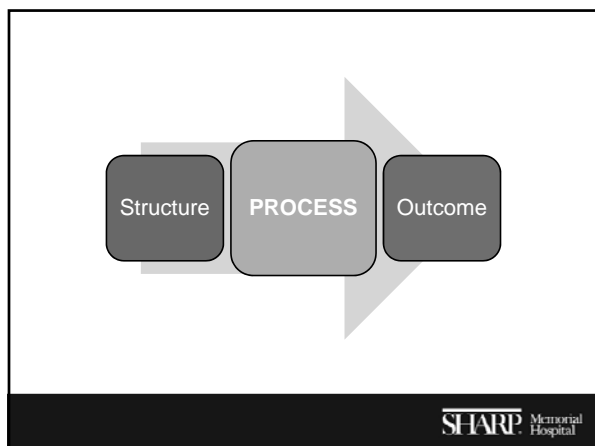
**Abstract Checklist**

- ☐ Is the title clear, descriptive, innovative?
- ☐ Can people from other fields understand it?
- ☐ Is the abstract clear and concise?
- ☐ Are acronyms explained?
- ☐ Is the abstract free from grammar, spelling errors, and awkward sentence structure?
- ☐ Is the abstract factually correct?
- ☐ Are the guidelines (such as word count limit) followed?

- What it is:** NKI Council developed a series of dissemination info sheets to address a measure/deliverable
- Why it is important:** Effective strategies/formats for abstracts, poster and podium presentations and writing for publication increase quality of the product
- What success will look like:** Increased quality will result in abstract and manuscript acceptance and positive feedback about poster and podium presentations
- What we need from you:** Incorporate the strategies and tips when writing abstracts or manuscripts or preparing posters and podium presentations

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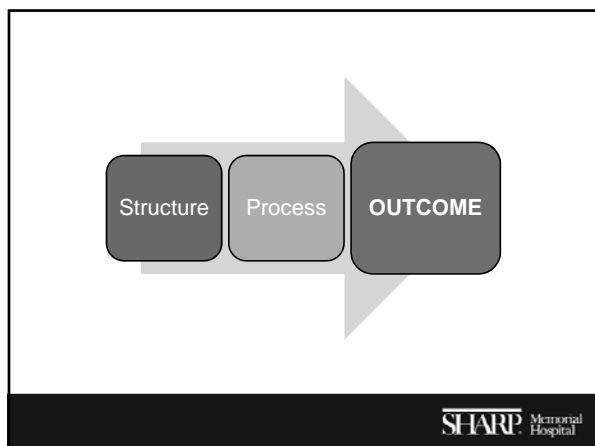
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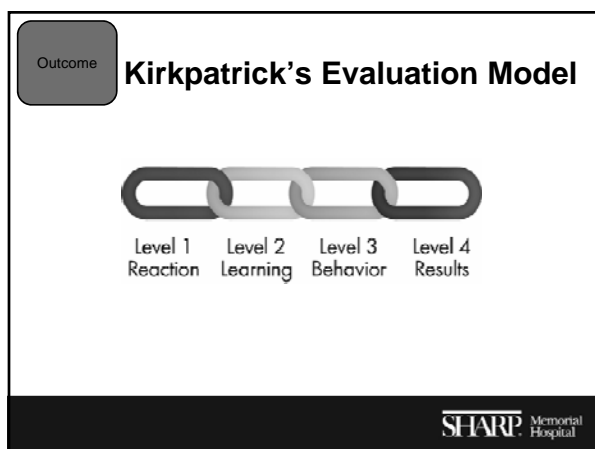
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Kirkpatrick's Evaluation Model			
Level	Evaluation Type	Evaluation Description	Examples of Methods
1	Reaction	Reaction evaluation is what participants thought and felt about the education event.	Course evaluations
2	Learning	Learning evaluation is the measurement of the increase in knowledge and skills and changes in attitudes – ideally before and after the event.	Pre/post-tests, return demonstration, case study discussion, reflective learning
3	Behavior	Behavior evaluation is the extent of transfer of knowledge, skills, and attitudes from the educational event to the practice setting – implementation. Allow sufficient time for a change in behavior to occur.	Observation, demonstration, document review, rounding
4	Results	Results evaluation is the effect on outcomes as a result of participation in education event and behavior change.	Predetermined outcome measures

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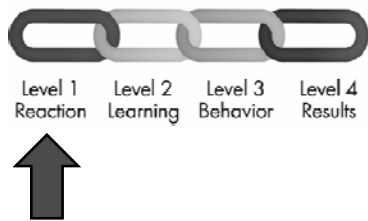

  - Course evaluation

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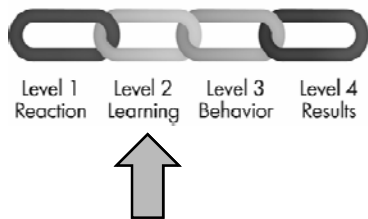
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## Kirkpatrick's Evaluation Model

  - Demonstration of concept mapping
  - Review of written abstracts
  - Review and observation of presentations
  - Evaluation of posters



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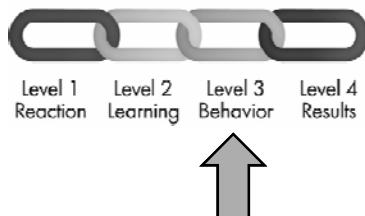
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## Kirkpatrick's Evaluation Model

- Integration of knowledge and skills into practice
- Validated through review of:
  - Abstracts
  - Posters
  - Podium presentations
  - Manuscripts



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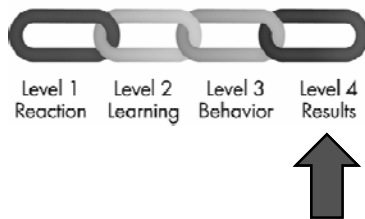
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## Kirkpatrick's Evaluation Model



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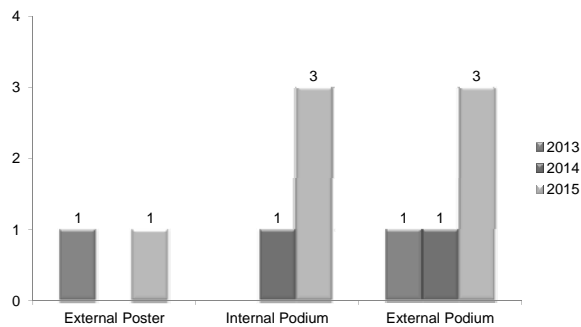
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## Clinical Nurse Dissemination – NK2



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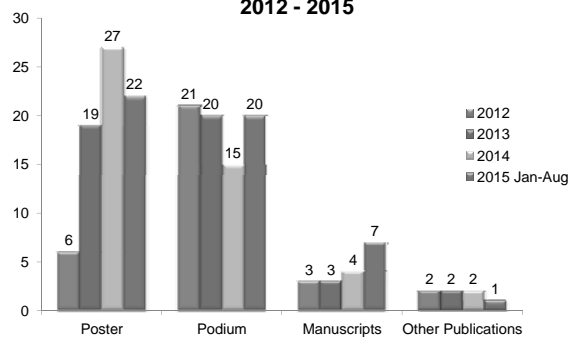
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## Sharp Memorial External Dissemination 2012 - 2015



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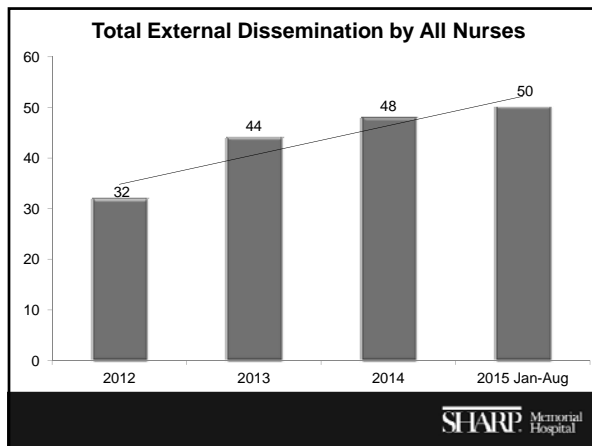
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**Dissemination Barriers and Facilitators**

Barriers	Facilitators
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cost to submit abstract</li> <li>• Competitive abstract acceptance</li> <li>• Cost of materials</li> <li>• Registration and travel to conferences</li> <li>• Time and competing priorities</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Select conferences (and journals) strategically</li> <li>• Mentor novice submitters and presenters</li> <li>• Create funding source (Foundation/grants)</li> <li>• Schedule consistent time</li> </ul>

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**Dissemination Barriers and Facilitators: Charter Scope**

**Scope:** *Boundaries—Impact, What is in and out of our authority?*  
 Decisions will be limited to areas represented by membership and as applicable.

- In Control:
  - Develop, disseminate, and enculturate structures and processes related to:
    - Advancing research (NK1&EO)
    - Disseminating knowledge generated through research to internal audiences (NK2)
    - Evaluating and using evidence-based findings (NK3)
    - Facilitating innovations in practice (NK4&HQ, NK5&EC, NK6&EO)
  - Provide consultation to individuals and Collaborative Governance councils on the generation of new knowledge and integration of EB findings
  - Collect and analyze data on the progress of the organization toward research and EBP
  - Submission of abstracts and manuscripts with NK1 consultation and collaboration
- Within Influence:
  - Quality of proposals, abstracts, presentations, and manuscripts
- Out of Control:
  - Acceptance of manuscripts and abstracts
  - Dissemination of research findings to external audiences (NK2)

Continue to:

- Offer dissemination series and mentoring
- Collect and trend dissemination data for:
  - NK2: Clinical Nurses
  - Annual Report – all dissemination activities
